Work is quickly coming to an end on the new classroom additions. Just a few finishing touches to complete along with some final cleaning. Gaining the occupancy permit for the classrooms however, is dependent on the City of Onalaska. They need to sign off on the inspection of the complete Fire Alarm and Sprinkler system for the classrooms and auditorium and the installation of the elevator. Workers from OTIS began installing the elevator this week and the work should be completed by the end of January.



The majority of the effort has now shifted to the Chapel/Auditorium and the new ACE entrance. We have two major volunteer work days coming up on February 18th and 25th.
